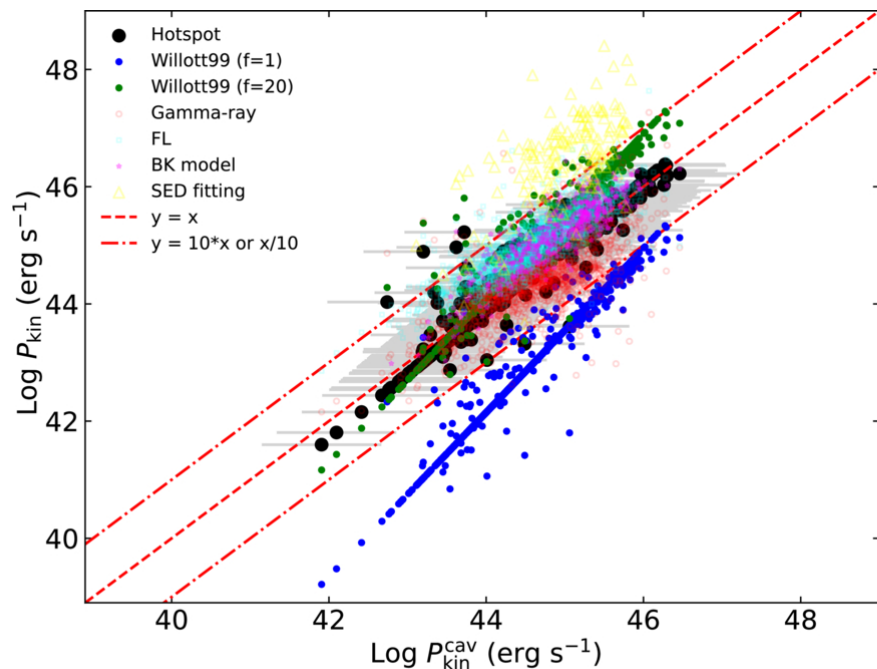
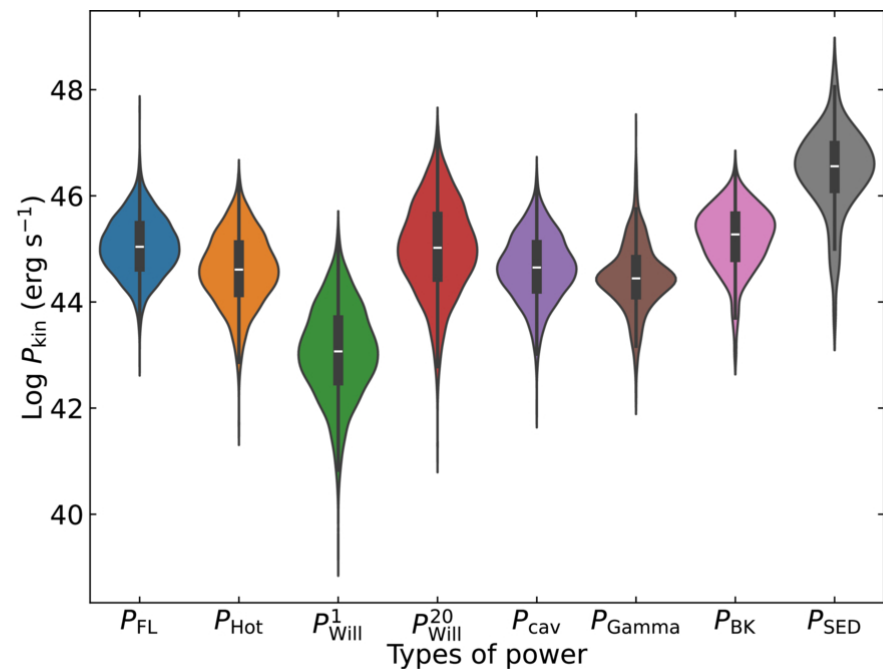


Figure 3. from

The horizontal axis displays jet cavity power, while the vertical axis shows jet powers estimated by other methods (color coded: Hotspot—method of hotspots, Willott99—C. J. Willott et al.
